How to identify concealed leaks!

Just because you can't see the water leaking, doesn't mean you don't have to pay for it!

Check your property

Watch out for:

- Reduced water pressure.
- Large tree roots near underground pipes.
- Patches of grass which are greener than the rest of the lawn.
- Water pooling or damp patches inside your home or around your property.

Check your water meter

Turn off all your taps. If the numbers on your water meter are still going up, you might have a leak.

I have a concealed leak. Now what?



Get it repaired

Call a licensed plumber immediately to fix the leak. If you are a tenant, call your landlord.

Call your water provider

You are responsible for the cost of any water leaks on your property. However, your water provider might be able to help. Ask them if they can offer a discount or payment plan to help cover the cost.
